**Ingredients for the Lemon Yoghurt Cake;**

11oz(300g) caster sugar  
2oz (50g) softened butter  
3 large eggs  
8oz (225g) Greek yoghurt  
Grated rind of one lemon  
6oz(175g) Self raising flour

**For the Icing;**

4oz (100g) sifted icing sugar and 1&1/2 tablespoons of lemon juice

**Method:**

Pre-heat oven to 180degrees/Fan 160 degrees/Gas 4. Grease and 8”(20cm) deep round cake tin and line the base with baking parchment. Beat together the sugar, butter and egg yolks in a bowl. Add the yoghurt and lemon and beat until smooth. Gently fold in the flour. Whisk egg whites to a soft peak stage and carefully fold into the mixture. Turn into the prepared tin. Bake in the pre-heated oven for 1-1/1 hours or until cake is well risen and firm to the touch. Leave to cool in the tin for a few minutes and then turn out, peel off the parchment and finish on a wire rack. For the icing mix together the sifted icing sugar and the lemon juice and pour over the cold cake. Smooth it over with a palette knife and leave to set.
